

Caswell County Adult Care Homes

Adult care homes, also known as “assisted living facilities”, provide care for persons age 18 and older who do not need nursing home care but are no longer able to remain in their own homes because they need help in meeting daily needs such as meal preparation and housekeeping. Adult care homes are for people who only need occasional and incidental medical services. Room and board, personal assistance, supervision of medications, and social activities are provided. The private cost rates vary from facility to facility and supplemental assistance may be available to cover the cost for those with limited incomes. Information on assistance may be obtained through the local Department of Social Services. “Assisted living” is a term used to refer to Adult Care Homes (7 or more residents) and Family Care Homes (2-6 residents). For more information regarding placement in any of these homes, contact your local Department of Social Services Adult Services section.
